

Skills Training

Life Skills: sessions are intended to orient the trainee back to the classroom setting and build team spirit despite the different backgrounds and diverse cultures.

Key areas in this session includeself-understanding, time and money management, improving one's interpersonal skills, relating well with people, understanding one's identity and background, goals and goal setting, expectations, SWOT Analysis, and gender roles.

Other topics in life skills include values and perceptions, attitude and positive thinking, decision making, self esteem, time management, and money management.











Security System and Guarding

There is huge demand for security guards in Kenya following the recent spread in insecurity. Private security firms have been in demand of well trained security men and women and that has been a great opportunity for CAP YEI trainees to access employment.

Hospitality

Tapping into the growth

The hospitality industry in Kenya creates up to 9.2% share of the total employment. Projections indicate that the industry continues to grow despite external and internal challenges. CAP-YEI has been training the youth on hospitality to match this projected growth in the industry.

Leather Work Technology

Leather production is one of the sectors that has not been explored to the fullest in Kenya. Most of the existing jobs are taken up by expertriates because many Kenyans have no work skills and expertise. CAP YEI decided to train youth in leather making skills for them to acccess the many job opportunities available. Already, all the trainees in leather technology have secured full employment





Automobile

There has been increase in the number of automobile vehicles in Kenya. Specifically, there is a great use of motorbikes and cars both in the big cities and in the villages. This requires technicians with expertise to fix them whenever they breakdown. CAP YEI saw this opportunity and introduced automobile training as an enabler for youth to access jobs or start their own businesses in this sector.









Capacity Building Creating local ownership

CAP Youth Empowerment Institute has been working to deliver its BEST Model to Kenyan youth for 4 years across vocational training centers. It has led to increased student enrollment, adoption of life-skills training, increased student retention, improved relationship between student and instructor, and improved student linkages to employment.
